



## **LANDSCAPE QUILTS (example shown)**

Forests, fields, seaside, mountains or your own backyard can be a landscape to create in fabric. Fabrics today are designed to give freedom to a quilter's imagination. In this introductory design class one will learn how to best use these new fabrics using fusible web, and machine appliqué to enhance designs for a very realistic appearance.

**YARDAGE:** 2 yds focal fabric that might include gradated fabrics, trees, water, skies, grasses,

$\frac{1}{4}$  yds of complementary fabrics to the focal fabric – batiks, gradated, tone on tones, texture prints

**SUPPLIES:** resources: Quilted forest décor, by Terrie Kralik and Points of View, by Valerie Header

Sewing machine in good working order

Thread – Sulky polyester invisible

Needle 70/10

Rotary cutter

Rotary mat

6" x 12" ruler

Appliqué scissors, very sharp-pointed 4"

Paper and fabric scissors

Freezer paper

Elmer's school glue stick-washable

Teflon (appliqué pressing sheet)

Steam a Seam 2 (lite) (package)

Fine tip black marker

**Necessary:** flannel back tablecloth or flannel back vinyl for design wall
