

SEMINOLE PIECING

(example)



Strip piecing takes on a new meaning when creating borders the way the Seminole Indians have for years. A wall hanging piece can be made in a day using a process that appears difficult but is easily constructed. This unique challenge is recommended to be tried by the more seasoned quilter.

YARDAGE:

1 completed 12 ½" square block
1 yd light fabric (compliment completed block)
1 yd dark fabric (compliment competed block)

SUPPLIES:

sewing machine in good working order
thread (neutral color, extra bobbins filled) 50 wt
(recommend Aurifil)
rotary cutter with new blade
rotary mat
6" x 12" ruler
15" sq ruler
BSS (basic sewing supplies) thread, seam ripper,
scissors, etc
stiletto

Necessary: small flannel back tablecloth, or flannel back vinyl for design wall
